Bailey was adopted on the evening of July 3, 2013 from Animal Friends Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (AFSPCA) in Richmond, IN by John and Julia Street of Greenfield. He was approximately 2 1/2 years of age. Bailey was named for Cincinnati Reds pitcher Homer Bailey who, on the evening of his adoption, pitched the first no hitter ever pitched in Great American Ball Park.

He passed from this life on May 20, 2019.

Bailey's early life had been difficult. His original owner was an elderly lady who died when he was only six months old. He was then inherited by her son who chained him to a dog house for two years and failed to provide him with adequate food and water. By the time he was removed from the home, he had become extremely anxious and fearful.

In his new forever home, Bailey found his purpose -- to care for those who could not care for themselves. He had a gift and a passion to care for the elderly and disabled. He began by caring for his Pawpaw in his own home and later began serving as a therapy dog in area nursing homes. Bailey loved his work and looked forward to seeing the many friends he made at the nursing homes. He loved them all dearly and they loved him.
