She is also survived by other humans: Aurelia Williams, Evan Spencer, Joshua Malone, Kaitlyn Malone, and Melissa Odom.

Licorice liked to shred paper. Any piece of paper she could find, she would rip into shreds. Her favorite activities were chasing after other dogs if she got loose. Licorice seemed to be extremely brave and have no idea that she was a small dog. If she got loose, she would go right up to a really big dog and start barking in its face. She also liked to bark at my other little dogs to keep them from jumping up on the bed and sleeping with me too. When she was younger, if she got loose, she would chase cars.
